Distribution Summary Footnotes:

1. The Bestwick Foundation (BF) is incorporated under the Pennsylvania Non-Profit Corporation Law of 1988. The BF is organized to operate exclusively at all times as a publicly supported organization described under Section 509 (a) (1) of the Internal Revenue Code. The BF is tax exempt as an organization described in Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Since our inception, Baker Tilly (and previously SF& Co.) has annually examined our bank statements, audited our financial records, and has subsequently submitted the required applications to the Pennsylvania Department of State Bureau of Charitable Organizations (BCO). Baker Tilly has also prepared and submitted all State and Federal Tax Returns for the BF. The BF is in good standing with the BCO, and with the State and Federal Tax Authorities.
2. Distributions to Individuals and Families, including MNMC contributions, account for \$87,434.60 (30.4%) of Total Distributions. MNMC contributions are also included here, as all of the MNMC contributions go towards helping individuals and families, after the cases have been vetted by MNMC's professional staff. If requested, certain confidential information relating to the any individual or family distribution can be provided.
3. Over the years, 70% of the residents of the Hope lodge are from the Centre Region. Distributions made to the Hope Lodge directly benefit these residents and their families while their family member is getting treatment at the Hershey Medical Center. This is the most effective way to efficiently impact a large group of people (residents of the Centre Region) during their fight against cancer.
